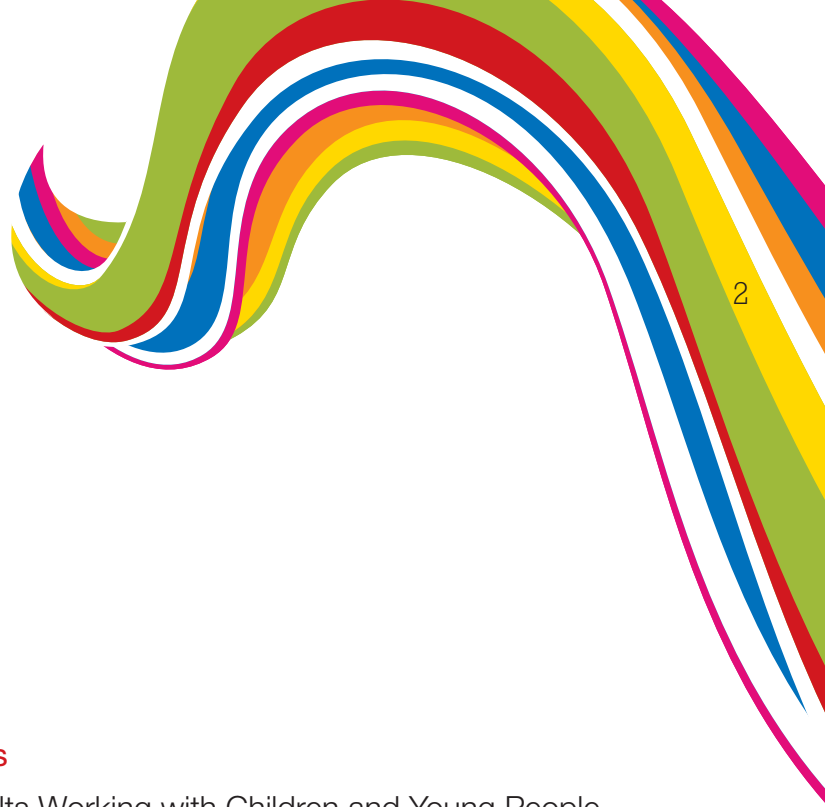

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Section 1

Setting The Scene

A Message from the Minister

As the Minister for Children, Education, Lifelong Learning and Skills I am fully committed to making the United Nation Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) a reality for every child and young person in Wales. Article 42 of the Convention says that Governments should make the Convention known to all parents and children and one of the key priorities we have in Wales is to raise awareness of the UNCRC with children, young people and adults so that everyone can understand how the UNCRC can make their lives better, and how children and young people can get their rights through the services that they receive.

This workshop tool is an introduction to the UNCRC and is just the beginning of a number of different resources that we hope to develop over the coming months. The workshops have been developed and piloted across Wales with the involvement of children, young people, parents, professionals and the partners that we work with. Their involvement has been invaluable and has ensured that the workshops fit for purpose and suitable for the target audience.

As a result of our ongoing work in this area, and that of our partners, over time I hope to see a significant improvement on the current level of awareness amongst children, young people, families and the entire children and young people's workforce including teachers and other school staff.

The UNCRC in Wales

The Welsh Assembly Government, with broader, all-party support from across the National Assembly for Wales, adopted the UNCRC as the basis for all its policy-making for children and young people in 2004. The subsequent Rights to Action 'translated' the articles of the convention into 7 Core Aims to make the planning of services for children and young people more coherent.

Article 42 of the Convention states that Governments should make the Convention known to all parents and children.

In line with this article, a key objective of the Welsh Assembly Government is to increase awareness of and promote of the UNCRC to children, young people, parents, families, adults and anyone working or involved with children and young people.
